OUR CAMPAIGN

Most security officers are people of color. The pay is lousy and often half of what other building service workers earn. Training is inadequate. Yet, as the first line of defense, we often put our lives on the line.



We are fighting to change these conditions. So far, over 6,000 security officers in New York City have organized. We have won a voice on the job and many have won real improvements in pay, health care and training.

But real change in the industry can only happen when all security officers in New York City organize and set a new standard for the industry.

OUR GOAL

This April security officers across the city will be fighting for an area-wide agreement that sets a standard for wages, health care and training. By setting a standard for the market, we will be able to turn security jobs into good jobs, where our work is valued, our city is safe and our families and communities have a brighter future.
