Utilities & evictions

- **Evictions have temporarily been halted**, so you cannot be removed from your home for falling behind on rent.
- During the crisis, **utilities are not allowed to cut off** electric, gas, water, sewage, phone, cable TV or internet services or charge you any late fees for those services.

Health insurance and testing

- Maryland has opened an emergency enrollment period through June 15th. If you do not have employer coverage, you can go to www.MarylandHealthConnection.gov to apply for coverage.
- **Testing.** Like all laboratory tests, testing for COVID-19 is a clinical decision made by a health care provider. Four drive-thru COVID-19 screening and testing sites have opened in Maryland, but testing is strictly limited to Marylanders who have a referral from their health care provider and who have an appointment to be tested.
